Visual supports (PECS) will be providing for all activities as needed by each individual including social stories, visual schedules, prompts and cues. The goal for this program is for all the children to enjoy a nature based, child directed, adult facilitated summer program with a strong emphasis on expanding and building social connections and group participation. All participants will be paired with an adult or mentor to assist and facilitate participation and engagement.

Children of all abilities and ages are encouraged and welcomed!

Focus will be on having fun, making social connections, "being part of a group" and being a 'social detective' in nature as well as and being a flexible thinker and participant.

Program Details

- Daily opportunity to work with a typical peer mentor (reverse mainstreaming) during cooperative activities
